CHILDHOOD EMERGENCY Children First declares "childhood emergency" in Scotland

New research has revealed most adults in Scotland believe growing up here is worse than ever before.

We declared a "childhood emergency" in Scotland on the back of this research and are calling for urgent action to address neglect, abuse, poverty and a mental health crisis made worse by online harm.

Mary Glasgow, Children First chief executive, explained; "We have declared a childhood emergency in Scotland. The fact that almost two-thirds of people we surveyed believe growing up in our country is worse than ever should act as a horrifying wake-up call to everyone. We must put children first.

"Sadly, childhood is getting shorter in the fast-paced and dangerous world we now live in. More than a third of sexual crimes recorded by Police Scotland are against children. And, one in four children still live in poverty. As a society we are failing children."


of adults believe childhood is worse now, for children in Scotland, than it was in the past. Young people shared their concerns with us about being online at a recent workshop. The group revealed worries about cyberbullying, the dark side of social media, the sharing of photos and videos without permission, the use of artificial intelligence, unwanted contact from strangers and being served dangerous and explicit content.

One young person, Chloe*, said:

"It can be really traumatising with what's going on online. Teenagers can overthink a lot, have a lot of insecurities and can be really anxious."

At Children First we are here to help children, their families and the people that care for them by offering emotional, practical, and financial support.

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TESSA'S STORY Keeping Tessa safe

Children First started supporting Tessa when she was finishing primary school. At that time Tessa's dad had mental health problems and was misusing alcohol to cope. This led to him becoming abusive to the point where the police had to be called on several occasions.

Tessa was not feeling safe at home and was often scared to be there. Her mum was struggling to cope, and she couldn't support Tessa with the fear and anxiety she was feeling. After Tessa shared her worries at school, child protection and social work became involved and referred the family to Children First.

Sharon* from Children First worked with Tessa and her family to help keep them safe, feel calmer and build healthy relationships. Tessa, who is now in secondary school, said: "Back then I was struggling with my anxiety and panic attacks.

"My attendance at school wasn't great and when I was at school, if something had happened the night before at home I couldn't focus".

"I had a lot of different emotions going on that were making me feel very overwhelmed. I would think about the worst things that might happen. I felt really alone".

After Tessa met Sharon she felt that she had someone to turn to. Tessa could talk to Sharon and share her feelings. Sharon helped Tessa to cope with her anxiety. Tessa said: "If something did happen at home, I knew Sharon would be there when I needed her."

Over time, Tessa's mum and dad decided the best thing for the family would be for them to separate.

Tessa said: "When my dad moved out, I was still panicking about things that might happen. It would be all I would be thinking about when I was on my own.

"He would call me, and I felt like I had to answer and would worry he'd be angry if I didn't pick up. But sometimes when he called, he might have been drinking so I didn't know if it would be a good conversation or a bad conversation. Sharon helped me understand I didn't have to speak to him, and I didn't have to answer the phone.

"Sharon helped me change my mindset. I was taking on worrying about everyone else, but she encouraged me to put myself first.


"Me and Sharon did breathing exercises which helped a lot with my panic attacks and she made me a wee kit with aromatherapy oils that helped too. "Sharon helped us as a family with our communication. Me and mum understand each other much better now."

"Children First is such an amazing charity and they help people a lot. Everyone should know about them. Having them in my life made me feel so much better."

Reflecting on her future, Tessa added: "I really want to do social work when I'm older. If I can help other people with what I know now I think that would be a great thing to share. I want to be able to help other people feel better and not alone like Children First helped me."

FUNDRAISING SUPERSTARS April and Jessica conquer Ben Nevis

April Aitken and Jessica Williamson-Donald recently conquered the biggest mountain in the UK to raise vital funds for Children First.

The two girls aged just eight and nine, who attend Lawmuir Primary School in Bellshill, raised more than £1,240, smashing their original target of fundraising £200.

Since the spring, April and Jessica have been climbing Munros named after their schoolhouses after deciding they wanted to raise money for a charity that protects all of Scotland's children.

The girls completed their challenge at the end of September when they hiked all 4,411ft of Ben Nevis. Their achievement was celebrated with a special presentation at their school assembly.

The two young fundraisers have also reached the summits of three other mountains - Ben Lomond, Ben Vorlich and Schiehallion – battling through all kinds of Scottish weather to achieve their goal.

April said; "We wanted to raise money for Children First because they are there for children who need help all around Scotland. When we got to the top of Ben Nevis I felt exhausted and tired but really proud."

The two adventurers are now setting their sights on bagging all 282 Munros across Scotland.

Jessica said; "Ben Nevis was hard-going and was so snowy at the top I could slide down! It was busy up there with lots of people. It felt very good when we reached the top. I want to climb all the other Munros in Scotland now."

April and Jessica's mums are both extremely proud of their daughters' amazing achievement, their resilience and positive attitude.

April's mum Sara said; "The girls are superstars. Even when they got tired they never thought of turning around. They were determined to keep going and make sure they raised money for Children First."



We cannot thank April and Jessica enough for their fantastic fundraising efforts and we truly admire their determination to reach the top of the biggest mountain in the UK. Every penny they have raised will go towards supporting children and families when they need it most.
