On their T-shirt twice to be doubly brave

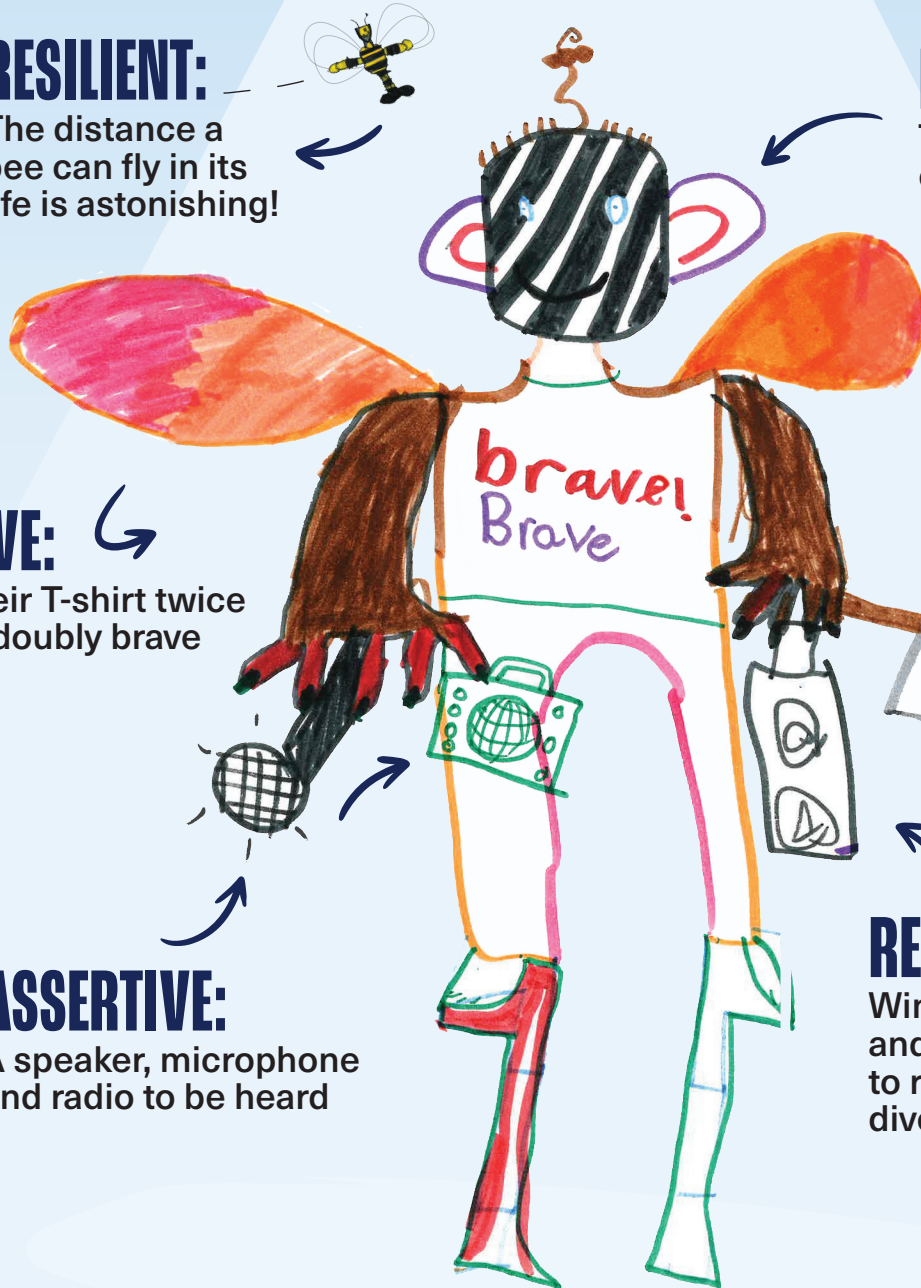
